It is now on it's way to Wau hospital but will need to make two more trips or maybe three with those that we can not help. Pray for the driver, as the distance is 70 miles one way and three hours on a dirt road. The injuries are so severe we are not sure that even Wau hospital will be able to assist them. It is overwhelming — please pray!

One family of six traveling together lost four people. It is so sad. These frequent deadly collisions are too common and we ask you to intercede. Sabet has spoken with the commissioner and they plan to meet and address the need for some controls on the road. Pray for wisdom and favor as our tiny rural clinic can not cope with these large medical emergencies.

MISSION TRIP TO SOUTH SUDAN

WILLIAM & HANNAH LEVI WITH OPERATION NEHEMIAH

On February 7, I left with my whole family to direct a six week Mission trip to the South Sudan where I will be leading three sets of missionary teams coming to join us in the field during February and March. The Lord brought **Operation Nehemiah Mission** into existence almost twenty years ago to proclaim the Good News, bind up the broken hearted, bring hope, and restore and strengthen families and widows in the South Sudan.

PLEASE PRAY FOR US:

- We will be conducting a two day conference with the theme: "The Fight for the Heart of South Sudan – Secularism and Islam vs. the Christian Social Order (the Family and Church of Jesus Christ.)" A list of people are invited, including government officials and church elders from various churches. It will take place on March 7, 2012 at Beth Israel Messianic Congregation, Borongole, Eastern Equatoria State, South Sudan hosted by the Congregation's Pastors Michael Levi and Peter Taban, and myself - Founder of ONM and Elder of BIMC. The key note speaker will be Geoffrey Botkin, President, Western Conservatory of Science and Arts from Tennessee.
- Our Ministry Team will be visiting several families, churches and communities in Madi Corridor in Magwi County, and Eastern Equatoria State to educate and strengthen families and the church in their roles to rebuild the South Sudan for Jesus Christ by teaching on Biblical Conflict Resolution and conducting Biblical Leadership Training workshops.
- A visiting team will be drilling two wells one for the Mission and one for the farmland.

Dear Friends, Some of you may or may not know, but Paul has been sick and in the hospital. It has been difficult to communicate while things were happening. The update is that he was finally released today, after 11 days. He is stable now, although they don't know all the reasons behind the problems. It began with three days of a severe allergic reaction. He had two surgeries this week to fix some damage from that reaction.

The Ministry is continuing under the very gifted and able hands of local pastors he has discipled for many years, and our local Ministry Advisory Committee. We thank the Lord for them up for such a time as this. There are over 275 Pastors and Ministry leaders attending this Semester, and God is moving in a powerful way.

We would appreciate your continued prayers, encouragement and support for the ministry and us. We are very thankful for your financial support and your kindness!

On February 12, Marcia wrote:

Dear Friends, Thank you for your ongoing prayers for Paul, the ministry and our family. He is recovering well, and hopes to visit the Bible Schools next week. Please join us in thanking the Lord for delivering us through this trial, and for raising up the indigenous pastors to fully carry on with the Ministry. In fact, enrollment has increased! Please continue praying as physicians are still trying to uncover Paul's underlying medical causes, and prevent a reoccurrence.



From Tonj - South Sudan Sabet and Suzy Kuj with In Deed and Truth Ministries

On February 7, Suzy Kuj wrote:

Our clinic is very busy since last evening after 13 patients were brought to our clinic yesterday after they had an accident .The car was coming from Rumbek to Tonj and was hired by a man named Ding. The car had a puncture and as the driver tried to control it, it overturned several times. This happened in Morol Akech in Northern Barl Ghazal near Mapel approximate 160 miles away from Tonj. These young men who were riding in the car were hired to come to Tonj to make bricks.

Our medical staff of Doctors were alerted and they all joined hands to save these lives. Praise God for our community health workers; when they heard about the accident they came as fast as they could to give a hand. Two of these patients were badly injured, one had a head fracture and the hand of the other has deep wounds. Albino and I went to pray for these patients and shared shortly about God and some of them agreed to come to our church every Sunday and said they trust God because He saved them from the accident. Five of them need to be transferred to Wau for further treatments, but the rest might be discharged today or tomorrow. Please pray for these young men to be healed and to accept Jesus as their personal Savior.

We thank God no one died but there is one young man missing - they were four-teen in number. Pray for these young men to be healed and the missing one to be found. Dr Stick and the team are also doing other surgeries. Please pray for God's divine intervention in both areas. God bless you for your generous contribution and for praying for this ministry.

Another car accident. This time head on at high speed with two full land cruisers. Both drivers were killed instantly along with 14 others just twenty minutes from Tonj town. The survivors, 11 men, 2 women and one 3 year old boy were critically injured and brought to our clinic, the only open medical facility with professional medical staff within 100 miles.
